Class Work:

Class work will be mixed between lecture and hands on application in the computer lab. Students that have compilers at home can make arrangements to electronically mail their work to me at Liberty.

Graded Evaluation:

Written tests will be taken at the end of each logical section. These tests will contain free response questions; fill in the blank questions, multiple-choice questions, debugging scenarios and coding problems. Every program assigned will be graded by assigning point values to tasks in a variety of categories such as comments, modularity, use of variables, etc. Late programs will lose 7 points for each day late (up to 5 days late).

Grading Policy:

Each 4 1/2 week grade will be computed as follows:

- Programs 40%
- Tests and Quizzes 40%
- Projects / Assignments 20%

The two nine-week grades will be computed as follows:

- 4 1/2 week grade 40 - 45%
- 4 1/2 week grade 40 - 45%
- Exam 10 - 20%

The final grade will be computed by averaging the two individual nine-week grades.


Supplies:
